I. STATUS

- A. <u>Meetings</u>: The Scallop PDT met by conference call on January 24th, February 10th, March 17th, and March 31st, 2020. The Scallop Advisory Panel met in Boston, MA on February 26, 2020 and by webinar on March 26, 2020. The Scallop Committee met in Boston, MA on February 27, 2020, and by webinar on March 27, 2020.
- B. <u>Framework 32</u>: Framework 32 became effective on April 1, 2020. This action also includes alternatives that would mitigate impacts on Georges Bank yellowtail flounder and Northern windowpane flounder.
- C. <u>Amendment 21:</u> The Council is expected to vote on the range of alternatives that would be included in this action. The Council is considering changes to how the Northern Gulf of Maine area is managed, Limited Access General Category IFQ trip limits, and the one-way transfer of IFQ from Limited Access vessels with IFQ to LAGC IFQ only vessels.
- D. <u>Emergency Action:</u> On March 27, 2020, the Scallop Committee voted to request that the Council consider asking NMFS to take emergency action in response to the COVID-19 national emergency.
