Scallop Committee

I. STATUS

- A. Meetings: The Scallop PDT met by conference call on June 27, 2019 and September 12, 2019. The PDT met on July 24, 2019 in Boston, MA, on August 27 & 28 in Woods Hole, MA, and September 4, 2019 in New Bedford, MA. The Scallop Advisory Panel met on September 18, 2019 in Boston, MA. The Scallop Committee met on September 19, 2019 in Boston, MA.
- B. <u>Framework 32:</u> On June 11, 2019 the Council initiated Framework Adjustment 32, an action that will set scallop specifications for fishing year 2020 and default measures for 2021. This action is also expected to include measures to mitigate scallop fishery impacts on Georges Bank yellowtail flounder.
- C. <u>Amendment 21:</u> In May and June of 2019, the Scallop Committee and Council tasked the PDT with development of alternatives to address the goals and objectives of Amendment 21. The Council is expected to continue to develop alternatives this fall.
