Meeting Motions

Amendment 23/Groundfish Monitoring

Motion 1: [Groundfish Committee carried 3/0/5]

To add to the alternatives a review process to evaluate the efficacy of rates of coverage, to include metrics or indicators of how well the program improved accuracy while maximizing value and minimizing costs.

Motion 2: [*Groundfish Committee carried 6/0/3*]

To add an option to (a) set a standard (i.e., observer bias) to measure the effectiveness of at-sea monitoring at the sector-level, and (b) if the sector is not meeting the set standard, then provide the ability in the monitoring plans to correct the problem.

Motion 3: XX/XX

[This motion was tabled and postponed by the Groundfish Committee to the June 2019 Council meeting, motion to table carried 8/0/1.]

Move that if the Council agrees to exempt vessels based on catch composition that those exemptions be reviewed every five years.

Framework Adjustment 59/Specifications

Motion 5: Stockwell/XX

To initiate Framework Adjustment 59/Specifications to include:

- 1. 2020 total allowable catches (TACs) for US/Canada stocks of Eastern Georges Bank (GB) cod, Eastern GB haddock, and GB yellowtail flounder,
- 2. 2020-2022 specifications for fifteen groundfish stocks, and
- 3. Address commercial/recreational allocation issues if raised by new Marine Recreational Information Program (MRIP) data.
