


### **Deep-Sea Coral Amendment**

- Implemented July 26, 2021 (<u>regulations</u>)
  - Deep-Sea Coral Protection Areas: Georges Bank, Outer Schoodic Ridge, Mount Desert Rock
  - Transiting and framework adjustment provisions
  - Jordan Basin Dedicated Habitat Research Area

- 2021 Council Priority: "Assess the possibility of and, if possible, develop an action to revise HMAs on the Northern Edge of Georges Bank"
- Habitat PDT drafting white paper
  - Background
  - Habitat, fishery characteristics of area
  - Gear effects studies and relevant findings
  - Considerations for undertaking an action
- October 26: Committee and Advisory Panel update
- Subsequent Committee meeting: recommend whether Council should initiate an action
- No Council action required today



### Aquaculture Development

- NEFMC and MAFMC <u>commented</u> on two draft strategic plans for aquaculture research and interagency coordination
  - Plans: <u>https://www.fisheries.noaa.gov/action/agencies-seek-public-input-aquaculture-regulatory-efficiency-and-science-planning-task-force</u>
- Aquaculture Opportunity Areas
  - Work related to Regions 1 and 2 (Gulf of Mexico and Southern California) is ongoing (i.e., regional atlases)
  - Regions 3 and 4 should be announced in the coming months

### **Blue Water Fisheries**

- NMFS is the lead agency on the EIS (with EPA and USACOE)
- Developer wants to include Atlantic Salmon in the project
- NEFMC has an FMP for <u>Atlantic salmon</u>
  - § 648.41 Framework specifications.
    - (a) *Within season management action*. The New England Fishery Management Council (NEFMC) may, at any time, initiate action to implement, add to or adjust Atlantic salmon management measures to:
      - (1) Allow for Atlantic salmon aquaculture projects in the EEZ, provided such an action is consistent with the goals and objectives of the Atlantic Salmon FMP
- NMFS will reach out to the Council on this issue soon

## **Council Policy on Wind Energy**

- Adopted June 2018
- PDT recommending specific additions, including:
  - Habitat mapping and characterization
  - Issues to consider in impacts analyses
  - Avoidance of activity during spawning and settlement
  - Coordinating research and monitoring across projects
  - Coordinating layouts across projects
- Committee and Advisory Panel will discuss on October 26
- Anticipate Council approval of updated policy in December
- No Council action required today

### **Council Policy on Wind Energy**

On June 14, 2018, the New England Fishery Management Council adopted policies related to offshore wind energy and oil and gas development, as recommended by the Council's Habitat Committee. These policies were originally developed by the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council. The wind energy section of the policy was updated on XX 2021 based on the Council's growing experience with wind energy development combined with the evolution of offshore wind technology which will likely have different environmental effects as compared to fixed offshore wind.

### Policy Goal

The Council supports efforts to mitigate the effects of climate change, including the development of renewable energy projects, provided that risks to the health of marine ecosystems, sustainable fisheries, and ocean habitats are minimized.

### Best management practices and stakeholder engagement

- Best management practices<sup>1</sup> should be employed throughout all phases of offshore wind development and operations to avoid adverse impacts on fish and their habitats and to prevent conflicts with other user groups, including recreational and commercial fisheries.
- The Bureau of Ocean Energy Management and offshore wind developers should engage early and often with the fishing community. Outreach should include individual fishermen and fishing businesses, recreational and commercial fishing organizations, NOAX Fisharies, state resource management agencies, the Responsible Offshore Science Alliance, and the Councils.

### Project siting and environmental review

- Developers should accurately map and characterize all benthic habitat types throughout the entire project area (including cable corridors), especially complex habitats that are sensitive to impact, in accordance with NMFS' Recommendations for Mapping Fish Habitat.
  - Complex habitat are defined in <u>NMFS\* Recommendations for Mapping Fish</u> <u>Habitat</u> (March 2021) as: 1) Hard bottom substrates; 2) Hard bottom substrates with epifuana or macrolagae cover, and 3) Vegetated habitats (e.g., submerged aquatic vegetation and tidal wetlands).
  - b. These maps are essential for EFH consultations and to support other management and science needs.



- Plans to continue dialog around this issue




