## Agenda:

• Discuss PDT analysis with respect to the groundfish monitoring program, to assess whether:

- O CV requirements and methodologies are the most appropriate to verify area fished, catch and discards by species and gear type for the sector system, and;
- o ASM provides the sector fishery, recognizing heterogeneity within the fleet (e.g., trip length, homeport, etc.), the maximum flexibility to meet ASM goals and objectives.
- Discuss recent journal publications on monitoring in the groundfish fishery, and
- Other business, as necessary.

## **Directions:**

**From the North:** Route 93 South, use the left two lanes to exit 7 toward Cape Cod. Continue on MA-3 South, then MA-3 South/US-44 South, continue on US-3 South and it becomes US-6 East. Take exit 1C toward Massachusetts 6A/Sagamore, turn left onto Sandwich Road. At Bourne rotary, take the 4<sup>th</sup> exit onto MA-28 South/General MacArthur Blvd. At the traffic circle, take the 2<sup>nd</sup> exit onto MA-28 South then take the Thomas Landers Rd exit toward W. Falmouth. Turn left onto Thomas Landers Rd. (signs for Falmouth Tech Park Drive). Then turn right onto Technology Park Drive and a left turn onto Bernard St. Jean Drive.

The New England Fishery Management Council generally posts announcements of Plan Develop Team (PDT) meetings on the Council's website, occasionally with very little notice. An agenda may or may not be included. Team members may discuss topics, if listed, in any order or add other issues not contained in the meeting notice.

Members of the public may attend PDT meetings, or listen in if the meetings are broadcast, but should not expect to participate unless the PDT chair invites input. Public comments and questions will not be taken during PDT conference calls.

PDTs are responsible to the Council and work on technical analyses as directed by their oversight committee. Once complete, PDT work products are reviewed at oversight committee meetings to which the public is invited. It is at this point that comments are encouraged on a range of issues, including PDT reports and recommendations, proposed management options or other information that is relevant to the committee's business at that time. The committee, in turn, makes management recommendations to the full Council based on the full suite of information it has available to it.
