Groundfish Monitoring Program

Recent activity. The Committee and Council met in January 2016 to develop a problem statement for a groundfish monitoring action and tasked the PDT with additional analysis of the groundfish monitoring program.

Since the Council meeting, the PDT has been working on an analysis for the Committee to consider at its upcoming meeting on April 7th (Docs. 3a and 3b).

Next Steps. On April 7th, Council staff will provide an overview of the PDT's work (Doc. 3b). The Committee will discuss the analysis and potentially develop recommendations to the Council on possible alternatives for a monitoring action.

Windowpane Flounder Management Alternatives

Recent Activity: Council staff have prepared a draft windowpane flounder discussion paper in response to Council Priorities for 2015 and 2016 (Doc. 4a). This paper is the culmination of work completed throughout 2015 and early 2016.

Next Steps: On April 7th, Council staff will provide an overview of the windowpane discussion paper (Doc. 4b). After reviewing the discussion paper, the Committee may wish to develop recommendations for next steps. If this is the case, specific feedback is requested on the following sections: 2.0 Draft Problem Statement, 5.0 Draft Objectives, and 6.0 Potential Approaches.

Recreational Management Measures Process
