There will be a **Groundfish Committee** meeting at the **Fairfield Inn & Suites by Marriott**, **New Bedford**, **MA** on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>September 21</u>, <u>starting at 8:30 am</u>.

<u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of the Committee meeting is to discuss and make recommendations to the Council on: (1) Framework Adjustment 57- specifications and management measures (2) Amendment 23- groundfish monitoring, (3) 2018 priorities, (4) regulatory streamlining in response to recent Executive Orders, and (5) other business as necessary.

Meetings Topics. The following section outlines the meeting expected outcomes and future related meetings by discussion topic.

Framework Adjustment 57

This action, initiated at the June 2017 Council meeting, will incorporate any status changes for groundfish stocks and set specifications for all groundfish stocks for FY 2018 to FY 2020, set specifications for FY 2018 for US/Canada stocks (Eastern Georges Bank cod, Eastern Georges Bank haddock, and Georges Bank yellowtail flounder), evaluate the common pool trimester total allowable catches (TACs), modify Atlantic halibut management, modify the Southern windowpane flounder accountability measures for the large-mesh non-groundfish fisheries (e.g., scup and summer flounder), and revise the recreational management measures process.

Transboundary Resource Assessment Committee (TRAC) /Transboundary Management Guidance Committee (TMGC): The TRAC met July 11-14, 2017 in St. Andrews, NB, Canada to conduct assessments for Eastern Georges Bank (EGB) cod, EGB haddock, and Georges Bank yellowtail flounder. The TMGC met on Sept. 6-7, 2017 and the Steering Committee met on Sept. 8, 2017 in Halifax, NS, Canada to discuss quotas for US/Canada stocks and other management issues.

At the Meeting:

- US TMGC Co-Chair will provide a summary of the 2017 TMGC recommendations for US/CA stocks for 2018 quotas (3a-3f).
- Council staff will provide a summary of PDT work to date (4a-4e).
- The Groundfish Committee may wish to develop recommendations to the Council on the range of alternatives for Framework Adjustment 57.

After the Meeting:

The Council is scheduled to receive an update and discuss the range of alternatives for Framework Adjustment 57 at its September 2017 meeting.

Amendment 23: Groundfish Monitoring

The Council discussed A23 at its June 2017 meeting. The purpose of A23 is to improve reliability and accountability of catch reporting and to ensure a precise and accurate representation of catch (landings and discards).

At the Meeting:

- Council staff will provide a summary of PDT work to date (5a and 5c).
- The Groundfish Committee will discuss a draft outline of the range of alternatives (5a) and revisit a motion made at the June Council meeting that was recommitted to the Committee for further discussion (5b and see below).

June 2017 Council Motions

Ms. Etrie moved and Mr. Terry Alexander seconded:

to develop/hold a workshop that improves managers and industry reps understanding of the distinction between accuracy and precision. Additionally, this workshop should be used to identify or develop methods for using monitoring data in stock assessments that can clearly illustrate how ASM data could have the capacity to rescale a stock biomass.

Mr. Pappalardo moved and Mr. Grout seconded:

to recommit this motion back to the Committee.

The motion *carried* unanimously on a show of hands carried on a show of hands (15/0/0).

After the Meeting:

The Council is scheduled to receive an update on Amendment 23 at its September 2017 meeting.

Priorities for 2018

At the Meeting:

The Committee may wish to develop initial recommendations to the Council regarding priorities for 2018.

After the Meeting:

The Council is scheduled to hold an initial discussion of 2018 priorities at the September meeting. The Council plans to have a full discussion of 2018 priorities at its December meeting.

Regulatory streamlining in response to recent Executive Orders

Several recent Executive Orders have been issued about streamlining current regulations, and NOAA is seeking public input on the efficiency and effectiveness of current regulations and whether they can be improved.

At the Meeting:

The Committee will discuss whether there are any regulations in the Northeast Multispecies (groundfish) fishery management plan that could be eliminated, improved, or streamlined.

After the Meeting:

Recommendations to NOAA from the Committee will be summarized and provided to the Council.
