SUBJECT: Groundfish Committee meeting on Tuesday September 18, 2018

Groundfish Advisory Panel Report

Framework Adjustment 58: Specifications and Management Measures

The U.S. Transboundary Management Guidance Committee (TMGC) Co-Chair will provide an overview of the recent TMGC meeting (Doc. 3). Then, Council staff will provide an overview of the draft alternatives and Plan Development Team (PDT) analysis (Docs. 2, 4a-4d, and 6c). The Committee may wish to make recommendations to the Council.

Amendment 23: Groundfish Monitoring

Council staff will provide an update on progress on Amendment 23 including recent PDT analysis, and a progress report from the Fishery Data for Stock Assessments Working Group (Docs. 2 5, and 6b). The Committee may wish to make recommendations to the Council.

Possible Priorities for 2019

Upon reviewing recommendations from the Groundfish Advisory Panel (made at their Sept. 18 meeting) and Recreational Advisory Panel (complied via correspondence), the Committee may wish to develop initial recommendations to the Council regarding priorities for 2019.

After the Meeting

The Council will discuss Framework Adjustment 58 and Amendment 23 on Sept. 26, 2018. The Council is scheduled to hold an initial discussion of 2019 priorities on Sept. 27, 2018. The Council plans to have a full discussion of 2019 priorities at its December meeting.
