### Groundfish Plan Development Team (PDT) Webinar

#### Agenda:

The Groundfish PDT will meet to discuss:

- **Framework Adjustment 72 / Specifications and Management Measures** – prepare for an upcoming Scientific and Statistical Committee (SSC) meeting on October 21-22, 2025, and draft PDT reports on:
  - possible overfishing limits (OFLs) and acceptable biological catches (ABCs) for Cape Cod/Gulf of Maine (CC/GOM) yellowtail flounder, Southern New England/Mid-Atlantic (SNE/MA) yellowtail flounder, Georges Bank (GB) winter flounder, GOM winter flounder, SNE/MA winter flounder, white hake, and Acadian redfish for fishing years 2026-2030,
  - possible OFLs and ABCs for GB cod, GB haddock, and GB yellowtail flounder for fishing years 2026-2027,
- Other business, as necessary

Once complete, PDT work products are reviewed at oversight committee meetings to which the public is invited. It is at this point that comments are encouraged on a range of issues, including PDT reports and recommendations, proposed management options or other information that is relevant to the committee's business at that time. The committee, in turn, makes management recommendations to the full Council based on the full suite of information it has available to it.
