 - a.  - b. Staff are working closely with NOAA fisheries staff to complement and amplify how NOAA is engaging with BOEM, through NEFMC and MAFMC joint letters and comments. Does the Council want to endorse this approach or take a different approach?
 - c. There are opportunities for Council members or staff to represent the Council's perspective and interests, and share expertise, through regional science initiatives. Does the Council want to consider or endorse any particular level or type of engagement? Should the efforts involve staff, Council members, or both?
 - d. How can the Council most effectively interact with wind developers?
