Joint Omnibus Alternative Gear-Marking Framework Adjustment







This document was developed to help the Council select preferred alternatives for the Joint Omnibus Alternative Gear-Marking Framework Adjustment.

September 19, 2025 - Version I

Anticipated Council Action:

- 1. Prior to selecting preferred alternatives, the Council will receive a presentation on measures under consideration and their analyzed impacts on fishery resources, protected resources, the physical environment (EFH), and human communities (economic and social impacts) in the Joint Omnibus Alternative Gear-Marking Framework. The development of this framework action was led by the Greater Atlantic Regional Fisheries Office, in coordination with the New England and Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Councils.
- 2. Select the *preferred alternative* for Alternative Set 1 Authorization of approved gearmarking alternatives (Section 4.1).
- 3. Select the *preferred alternative* for Alternative Set 2 Requirements to use approved gear-marking alternatives (Section 4.2).
- 4. Motion to submit the Joint Omnibus Alternative Gear-Marking Framework to NOAA Fisheries. The Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council is expected to take final action on this framework action in October 2025.

Section 4.1 – Alternative Set 1 – Authorization of approved gear-marking alternatives Choose one.					
Alternative 1A	No Action This alternative would not allow for alternative gear marking and would maintain current surface marking requirements (radar reflectors, highflyers, etc.).				
Alternative 1B	Region-wide alternative gear marking This alternative would allow the use of alternative gear marking for fixed-gear fishing in all Federal waters within the Greater Atlantic Region.				
Alternative 1C	Spatially and temporally limited alternative gear marking This alternative would allow alternative gear marking during, and within, persistent buoy line restricted areas established by the TRP.				
Alternative 1D	Spatially limited alternative gear marking This alternative would allow alternative gear marking within persistent buoy line restricted areas established by the TRP during restriction periods and in the same geographical areas when restriction periods are not in place.				

Decisions/Questions/Information to Consider

- No alternatives would require the use of alternatively-marked fishing gear.
- Alternatives 1C and 1D would apply to current and future persistent buoy line restricted areas established by the Atlantic Large Whale Take Reduction Plan (TRP).

Alternative 2B	This alternative would require a person to obtain a Letter of Authorization documenting that they have demonstrated knowledge of how to mark gear with an approved gearmarking alternative.					
Alternative 2C	Letter of Authorization Only					
Alternative 20	This alternative would require a person to obtain a Letter of Authorization to use a gear-marking alternative but would not require the demonstration of knowledge to obtain the Letter of Authorization.
