#### Background

- Proposed rule published May 12, 2021 (86 FR 25992)
  - Public comment accepted through June 11, 2021
  - Public Hearing May 19, 2021
  - Advisory Panel Meeting May 25, 2021
  - Received 67 written comments
- Final rule published on August 9, 2021 (86 FR 43421)





# Summary of Comments





## Comments on resumed use of General category RFDs

- Support, noting that RFDs should prevent market gluts and lengthen the General category season within the subquota time-periods
- General concern that:
  - The proposed rule would inappropriately manipulate the market
  - The action is premature due to the unique impacts of COVID-19 in 2020
  - The action would not result in extending the fishery, but instead would lead to a derby fishery
- Suggestions that tournaments be exempted from RFDs given their economic importance to communities and because they are a source of valuable scientific data and information for bluefin tuna
- Questions and suggestions regarding how RFDs would be set in the future, e.g., for 2022



#### Comments on proposed 2021 RFD Schedule

- Implement starting early in June
- Implement starting in September
- Avoid weekends
- Avoid Fridays and Saturdays as demand to buy and sell bluefin tuna is greatest on those days

#### Final 2021 RFD Schedule

- The first RFD was Sept. 3 and the last will be Nov. 30.
- NOAA Fisheries may waive RFDs but will not modify RFDs in other ways (e.g., switching days or adding RFDs).
