Strategic & Operational Emphasis- Domestic & International

- Remain nimble to emergent needs of DHS/USCG.
- FY26: Continue to board HMS permitted vessels.
- Protect the domestic fishery through continuing pursuing criminal prosecution of fishing (Lacey Act) violations by Mexican lanchas.
- Foster high seas & EEZ patrols with partner nations, as priorities allow.
- Serve on ICCAT U.S. Delegation to promote at-sea inspections, act upon suspected IUU fishing sightings, & progress enforcement policy.

Strategic & Operational Emphasis- Domestic & International

- Implement recommendations from the DHS Office of Inspector General's Report on "Coast Guard Missed Opportunities to Interdict Foreign Fishing Vessels Suspected of Illegally Fishing in U.S. Waters;" published 06JUN25: oig.dhs.gov/sites/default/files/assets/2025-06/OIG-25-25-Jun25.pdf
 - Determine how to use available resources in CGD-H to increase the interdiction rate.
 - Develop and implement a performance goal for IUU-F enforcement on the high seas or within the EEZ of another nation.
