Furthermore, the Council's proposal for GB cod adopts additional recreational fishery measures to promote cod stock rebuilding and reduce recreational mortality by 68% from recent levels. The proposed recreational measures are:

- <u>Slot Limit</u>- The minimum size for GB cod would be 22 inches (55.88 cm.) and the maximum size would 28 inches (71.12 cm), total length for the recreational fishery (private, party, and charter).
- <u>Possession Limit</u>- Party, charter, and private vessels in the recreational fishery would be permitted to land 5 legal sized GB cod per angler, per day.
- <u>Season</u>- Party, charter, and private vessels in the recreational fishery would be prohibited from retaining GB cod from May 1 to July 31. No possession would be in place during this time.

In general, state regulations that are less restrictive than those in the federal plan can create enforcement challenges and reduce the effectiveness of the federal measures.
