SUBJECT: Purpose for Scallop Advisory Panel meeting on March 30, 2017

There is a Scallop Advisory Panel meeting at the Hotel Providence in Providence, RI on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>March 29, 2017 at 9:30 AM</u>. Please note there is a Committee meeting at that same location on March 30, 2017. <u>Paper copies will not be mailed to you before the meeting</u>. Documents for this meeting will be e-mailed to you as they become available.

Purpose: The main goals of this Committee meeting are to:

- 1) Review and begin work on the 2017 scallop work priorities. The Advisory Panel should be ready make recommendations to the Committee regarding the development of measures from the 2017 priority list that may be incorporated into a future management action. Council staff will present information on several work priorities.
- 2) Update on the 2017/2018 Scallop RSA award recommendations. The PDT, AP, and Committee will be discussing 2018/2019 RSA priorities at upcoming meetings.
- 3) Discuss other business as necessary.

The Scallop Advisory Panel will be considering input from the PDT at this meeting. The scallop report at the April Council meeting will be on April 18, 2017.

2017 Scallop Work Priorities

Recent Activity: The Scallop PDT has met in person and by conference call, and has had initial discussions regarding the 2017 work priorities.

Next Steps: Council staff will review the 2017 work priorities, and present initial PDT input on these issues. The AP should be prepared with recommendations for the Committee at this meeting.

Northern Gulf of Maine Management Area

Recent Activity: The Council has identified Northern Gulf of Maine Management Area measures as a priority for 2017. The Council took action to set the 2017 TAC based on recent survey data, and eliminate the ability of LA vessels to circumvent the DAS system and process scallops off the clock though FW28.

The Northern Gulf of Maine management area closed to all scallop fishing on March 23 when NMFS determined that the LAGC component had reached the TAC for the year. Both Limited Access and LAGC vessels operated in the area again this year. Council staff plan to provide an update on the 2017 NGOM effort and landings at the meeting.

Next Steps: Council staff will present background information on the NGOM management area, the 2017 fishery, and initial PDT input on this work priority. The AP should be prepared with recommendations for the Committee at this meeting.

Flatfish Accountability Measures

Recent Activity. The Council has identified the development of flatfish accountability measures as a priority for 2017. The Council took action in Groundfish Framework 56 to develop a scallop fishery sub-ACL for northern windowpane flounder, set at 21% of the overall ACL. The Council needs to develop accountability measures for this stock for the 2018 fishing year (regulatory requirement). The Council has also signaled interest in modifying existing Georges Bank and Southern New England/Mid-Atlantic yellowtail AMs with a focus on requiring gear modifications vs. time area closures. The PDT discussed scallop and flatfish catch data at its first two meetings.

Next Steps. Staff will review scallop and flatfish catch data with the Committee. The AP should be prepared with recommendations for the Committee at this meeting.

Update on other 2017 priorities

Recent Activity: The Council also identified the modification of access areas to be consistent with OHA2, gear modifications to protect small scallops, and integrating findings from the sea scallop survey peer review.

Next Steps: Council staff will provide an update these work items. The AP should be prepared with recommendations for the Committee at this meeting.

2017/2018 Scallop RSA Recommended Awards

Recent Activity: The 2017/2018 Scallop RSA recommended awards were announced on March 17, 2017. See Document 8 for details.

Next Steps: No Action is required at this meeting. The PDT, AP, and Committee will be discussing 2018/2019 priorities at upcoming meetings in May and June.
