Motion 7: Smith/Patterson

Move to develop NGOM TAC options in FW32 using the following approach:

- Maintain the same approach to TAC setting in the NGOM in 2020 and 2021 for the LA
 and LAGC components that was developed and implemented through FW29.
- Develop TAC options based on fishing the following NGOM areas at F=0.18, F=0.2 and F=0.25
 - Ipswich Bay
 - Jeffrey's Ledge

Rationale: These areas are the most likely to be fished in 2020. Survey results did indicate some recruitment within Jeffrey's, so the harvestable biomass may not be easily targeted. This range of F rates are consistent with previous analyses and maintain the conservative intent with setting the NGOM TAC.

The motion carried on a show of hands (7-0-0).
