

Amendment 21 to the Scallop Fishery Management Plan DRAFT Action Plan

Council: New England Fishery Management Council

Fishery Management Plan: Atlantic Sea Scallops

Title of Action: Amendment 21

Scope: Consider measures for: 1) the Northern Gulf of Maine (NGOM) Management Area, and 2) Limited Access General Category (LAGC) individual fishing quota (IFQ) possession limits.

Objectives:

Northern Gulf of Maine Management Area:

The Council is planning to develop measures that will support a growing directed scallop fishery in federal waters in the NGOM. To do so, the action will consider measures that would prevent unrestrained removals from the NGOM management area and allow for orderly access to the scallop resource in this area by the LAGC and LA components. This includes establishing mechanisms to set allowable catches and accurately monitor catch and bycatch.

LAGC IFQ Possession Limits:

The Council is planning to develop measures that will increase the LAGC IFQ possession limit as a way to improve overall economic performance of the LAGC IFQ component. The Council is taking action to ensure that the LAGC IFQ component remains profitable, and that there is continued participation in the General Category fishery at varying levels. To do so, the action will consider approaches that aim to reduce the impacts of decreases in ex-vessel price and increases to fixed costs (e.g. maintenance and repairs) and variable costs (e.g. trip expenses including fuel, food, oil, ice, and water), on vessels and crews
