

Background on SSWG

Previous recommendations related to scallop surveys:

Scallop Survey Peer Review – 2015:

Devise an optimal and integrated survey design recognizing the value of different sampling methodologies and designs

Council RSA Program Review – 2019:

Survey strategy with consistent implementation of a structured design would be effective and efficient for stock assessment and management purposes

Scallop Assessment SARC 65 – 2018:

Further investigate methods for better survey coordination between survey programs, including survey design, timing, and standardized data formatting for easier sharing


Scallop Survey Working Group (SSWG)

- Scallop Survey Working Group (SSWG) Council website:
 - https://www.nefmc.org/committees/scall op-survey-working-group
- Purpose:
 - Facilitate collaboration around integrated approaches to conduct scallop surveys that support stock assessments and management
 - Explore mechanisms to implement approaches

- Approved TORs (shorthand here, see website):
 - Describe the current survey system
 - Describe and assess a coordinated strategy for sea scallop resource assessment
 - Identify survey methods, tools, and designs to monitor and assess the scallop resource...that includes offshore wind installations and changes in resource and fishery distribution.
 - Identify and catalogue the survey data products needed to support stock assessment approaches in the future.

SSWG Work Plan

- Incremental approach to TORs
 - Simultaneous effort across multiple TORs
 - Sub-groups working between SSWG meetings





- <u>Updated</u> Meeting schedule
 - November 2021 Progress report on TORs; sub-group updates; initial recommendations
 - January/February 2022 Advance recommendations and implementation strategies
 - April 2022 June 2022? Final recommendations
 - Final report complete in July 2022?

Petition for Rulemaking Process: Scallopers Campaign Request for LA Leasing

Key Issue: DOC/NMFS has been asked to prepare an amendment to the Scallop FMP on LA leasing outside of the Council process.

Process so far:

- Request to the Secretary of Commerce on January 15, 2021
- NMFS letter to the Council on March 10, 2021
- Council reply to NMFS on July 19, 2021 (see correspondence)
- Scallopers Campaign letter to NMFS on July 29, 2021
 - Asked the agency to delay response to the Campaign's petition until after the Council's vote on 2022 scallop work priorities in December.

Next Steps:

NMFS response to Campaign's petition (TBD – likely after December 2021)

Two work items from last year's discussion that are currently on the list of possible priorities for next year.



2022 Priorities – PDT and Staff input

PDT Input:

- Anticipate and budget time needed to implement recommendations of SSWG and the Evaluation of Rotational Management (shown in timelines).
- Evaluation of rotational management: Consider additional research and analyses beyond the scope of the current project plan.

Staff Input:

- Should be time to begin new projects in the 2022 calendar year, or to expand on ongoing efforts (ex: evaluation of rotational management).
- Contractor support for SSWG and evaluation of rotational management continue into 2022.
- Expect to begin addressing LAGC IFQ program review in November or December of 2022, with most of the work occurring in 2023/2024.
- Early part of the year will be very busy with ongoing work (FW34, SSWG, ERM)
- Timelines provided indicate roughly when we expect to be working on each project. Time commitments will vary.


2022 Priorities - Staff input (continued)

Staff Input:

- Available staff resources will be determined by the final Council/FMP-wide work priorities.
- ~10 months of staff time per person available each year. Can't do everything that is on the list in one year.
- Consider providing guidance on what a "long-term strategic plan" for the scallop fishery would be? Concept is not well described yet. Looking for discussion on this topic.
 - FMP focus vs. Council wide-focus. <u>SAFMC focused visioning on snapper grouper fishery.</u>
 - Way to strategically address priorities of the scallop fishery over several years, as defined by stakeholders and the Council? Spend 2022 developing, and start in 2023?
 - Time scale: Medium term strategic planning (e.g., 3-5 years)?
 - Difficult to address short term requirements for annual specifications and other short-term needs, and to simultaneously address medium term challenges and opportunities.
