# Council Calendar: Here's the June 2020 Advisory Panel and Committee Meeting Lineup – Join Our Webinars!

The New England Fishery Management Council has scheduled several advisory panel (AP) and committee meetings during the first three weeks of June to address actions related to Atlantic herring, Atlantic sea scallops, groundfish, whiting/red hake, research priorities, and ecosystem-based fishery management. All meetings will be conducted by webinar. The results will be discussed by the full Council when it convenes June 23-25, 2020, also by webinar. Here's the June lineup.

WHITING/RED HAKE - Thursday, June 4: The Council's Whiting Committee and Whiting AP will meet jointly

to discuss proposed alternatives for rebuilding southern red hake, as well as other issues.

**ATLANTIC HERRING – Tuesday, June 9:** The Herring AP and Herring Committee will meet back-to-back to discuss, among other issues:

- Framework Adjustment 8, which includes specifications for fishing years 2021-2023 plus potential adjustment of herring measures that relate to the mackerel fishery; and
- Framework Adjustment 7, an action to protect spawning Atlantic herring on Georges Bank.
- The Herring Advisory Panel meeting will begin at 8:30 a.m.
- The Herring Committee meeting will begin at 1:30 p.m.

# Atlantic Herring Management Track Stock Assessment



A Spring 2020 Management Track Assessment has been conducted for Atlantic herring. The peer review of this assessment will take place on **Monday, June 22** beginning at 10:15 a.m. This is the day before the New England Council begins its <u>June 23-25 webinar meeting</u>.

- The results of the herring assessment will help guide the Council in setting 2021-2023 specifications for the fishery.


